## **Characteristics of the "EU Baseline"**

- Genetic resources are utilised in the EU for a wide range of purposes, by a wide range of actors with different interests
- Multiple actors at different stages of the value chain (collecting, basic research, applied research, product development)
- Future interest in R&D on genetic resources stable or increasing, while demand for 'in situ' access will depend very much on conditions that give legal certainty to users
- In situ access is mostly done by university-based researchers and scientists affiliated with ex situ collections.
- Commercial users rarely collect in the wild
- Ex situ collections play a fundamental role in the EU genetic resources value chain for both non-commercial and commercial users
- ABS best practices exist particularly up-stream in the EU user-chain

# **Implementing the Nagoya Protocol** – main features of the legislation

Nagoya Protocol

"access" pillar

"compliance" pillar

EU level

Each State/Party to decide if they establish access rules, incl. EU Member States, to be looked up on the ABS Clearing-House


Does my activity fall under the scope of the ABS regulation?

### Main features of the legislation – due diligence concept

"due diligence" obligation:

- When? Where? What?
- From whom and to whom?
- Access permit (PIC)?
- Mutually agreed terms?

where applicable

- incl. benefit-sharing
- Presence or absence of rights and obligations?

insufficient info / uncertainties





## **Legislative Procedure**

- Political agreement between European Parliament and Council since December 2013
- Endorsed by the sub-committees of both institutions in December 2013 and February 2014 respectively
- Formal decisions of EP Plenary reached in March 2014
- Formal decision of Council to be completed in April 2014
- Ratification ahead of a possible CBD/NP CoP/MoP
- 1 in October 2014
